This course is suitable for both experienced and inexperienced teachers and teacher trainers.

Participants will need at least an upperintermediate level of English (B2/B2+)

Course summary

This course will explore the very nature of humanistic teaching and what is behind it. We will firstly go over the main principles of Humanistic thinking as outlined in psychology by Rogers, and Maslow. We will look at the application of the humanistic theory in teaching and will create ways of fostering motivation and encouraging continuous development of students and teachers alike. In this slightly dehumanised world of growing bureaucracy and technological advancement, we will focus on creating a teacherand student-friendly environment by making relations and emotions an integral part of the learning and teaching process.



Course content

- A brief look at Humanism and its principles in language teaching
- What makes a teacher humanistic
- Humanising your teaching environment, syllabus and school
- How to make your teaching materials more personal
- Group dynamics in a humanistic classroom
- How to create a powerful and motivating learning environment
- Personalising and humanising online learning
- A holistic approach: teachers' self-care and how to help your students grow

Preparation

Each applicant is to send in an action plan four weeks before the course, outlining their hopes and objectives.

Objectives

The course aims to provide participants with the expertise to make their teaching more humanistic, enhancing the learning outcomes and making learning more relevant to their students.

Expected results

As a result of attending this course participants will acquire both a solid background in humanistic language teaching as well as a set of practical tools to be implemented in their teaching.
