Course summary

This course will explore the very nature of humanistic teaching and what is behind it. We will firstly go over the main principles of Humanistic thinking as outlined in psychology by Rogers, and Maslow. We will look at the application of the humanistic theory in teaching and will create ways of fostering motivation and encouraging continuous and harmonious development of students and teachers alike. In this slightly dehumanised world of growing bureaucracy and technological advancement, we will focus on creating a teacher and student-friendly environment by making relations and emotions an integral part of the learning and teaching process. The course aims to provide participants with the expertise to make their teaching more humanistic, enhancing the learning outcomes and making learning more relevant to their students
