Course summary

Teaching teenagers and young adults can be challenging yet rewarding. This course is designed to give teachers a practical set of tools to engage students, manage interactions in the classroom, and create meaningful and positive learning experiences.

Based on a learning-centred and humanistic approach, the course focuses on relationships, fostering student voice, and creating a positive and nurturing environment where everyone feels valued. Participants will explore community-building techniques, how to regulate attention, approaches to mediation and conflict resolution, amongst many other topics, and bring creativity, curiosity and critical thinking into every lesson.

Through hands-on workshops, collaborative tasks, reflection, participants will experiment with multimodal literacies, discover ways to integrate technology responsibly, design lessons that flow and cater to the needs of diverse students. A strong emphasis is given to teacher wellbeing and developing inclusive practices with care and empathy.

By the end of the course participants will leave with a personalised toolkit of resources, strategies, and approaches which can be applied immediately across all subjects and educational contexts.
