#### Target audience

Those teaching intermediate students and above from lower secondary age groups and above (levels B1 and above). This course is NOT really suitable for Primary School teachers unless their learners are higher level than usual, like e.g. MYP. You will need an advanced level of English (C1)

#### Course summary

This is a methodology course which also includes a substantial English language improvement element.

This course will open your eyes to how to implement mediation (as defined by CEFR) into English classes. Mediation is a relatively new concept in ELT and a new territory to be explored.

The course offers a wide range of exciting areas to explore with students. It will provide you with activities and strategies to improve both your own and your students' mediation skills in English and generally in contacts with people.

This course also provides a large amount of English practice throughout.
